## Morning of 9/20/2024

- Introductions made by Tom Worth, Director of Research and Economics Branch of ERS
  - Discussed the current workforce of ERS
    - Mostly new, mostly remote
  - Very proud and excited about the partnership between ERS and W5001
- Danielle Rhubart
  - o Gave introductions, read from an article in 1893 from the Secretary of Ag
  - Provided overview of the day, W5001, and our objectives
- Individual introductions
- Collaborative project updates
  - Shannon Monnat and John Green presented on the plans for the new decadal volume from RSS
    - Overall theme
      - 2020s started with the shock of covid, but there are many others
      - Focused on the shocks and stressors in rural America
      - Rural America is not monolithic
      - Rural-urban are socially integrated
      - 22 chapters, publisher is worried about length
    - Broad and comprehensive
    - Danielle Rhubart
      - Can we add discussion guides for each chapter and put them online
    - Only reason it doesn't get published is if it is too long
  - o Richelle Winkler

- Net migration estimates by age and race and sex and Hispanic origin
- The website is now totally updated
  - Hispanic estimates are not on there due to PEB updates
    - Will be soon
- Data is now available on AIAN and Asian for the first time

- INRPHA is putting together a pre-conference workshop at PAA on aging, health, and climate change
- Starting a virtual center on climate, aging, and health called CACHE
  - Sharing code, training materials,
  - Boulder, CUNY, University of Washington, Minn Pop, Calijo (?) in Mexico city

  - INRPHA is an NIA R24 research network
  - First five years were very successful
    - Grant mentoring, seed grants, workshops
  - Was renewed for another five years
  - New PI is Carrie Henning-Smith
  - Old PIs carrying on as co-I's
  - Call is up and due soon
  - Encouraging use of NIA-funded data that has utility for rural research
  - Must focus on the United States

  - Very long process with lots of reviews and a formal process

- o Census Update
  - Richelle
    - New directive SPD15 that will change the race and ethnic categories on all federal survey or agency records or HR forms
      - Ethnicity is no longer separate
      - MENA is a new group
      - ACS is rolling this out in 2026
        - There will be guidance for bridging, but won't be perfect
      - Edith-Marie
        - There are people at UW working on this
      - Congress has not yet passed appropriations
        - Senate appropriations passed a strong resolution for Census
        - House appropriations passed a version that would cut Census Bureau funding
          - Also included...
            - Section 621 states none of the funds in this act may be used to for involuntary compliance, nor may be used after two voluntary attempts
            - Section 559 no funds used to allow Census Bureau to include undocumented aliens in apportionment
          - Check out The Census Project to get information on all of this
            - Richelle will send it out

- Danielle reminded people to not use your work email or work title when lobbying or writing a representative
- Shannon noted that you should use PAA's form letters
- The Census Project is discussing issues within the ACS
- The new RUCC codes are out
- The new typology codes are coming out soon
- The 2030 Census Advisory Committee is up and running, if you have ideas you should reach out to them
- State will be doing their complete count committees soon
  - Can get involved
  - John Green made the case to get involved
- Household pulse survey is transitioning its design to something that will last over time
  - Longitudinal design
- Pop estimates program has been doing things differently
  - This means that the exact methodology has been shifting, which impacts year on year comparisons
  - Every time they release a new vintage they have a new base that comes with it
- Eleanor mentioned that if you have not received a receipt then you have note paid
- The contextual data is being moved and adjusted and we will revisit it next year
- Next year
  - Jessica proposes that our meeting occur on Tuesday before RSS in Park City
    - David Brown wants the flash talks to continue
    - Jessica has some relationships up in Park City and has ideas for spaces
- Year after that?
  - David Peters suggested putting it at RDC locations or ERS or other entities we want to have more of a relationship with
