

FLOOR PLAN FIRST LEVEL






Breakfast

THEME DAY SPEAKERS



Antoine Bouët

Antoine Bouët is Director of CEPII as of October 1, 2022, Professor of Economics at the University of Bordeaux (France) and Non-Resident Senior Research Fellow with the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI). Previously, he joined the IFPRI in Washington DC in February 2005 as a senior researcher to conduct research on global trade modeling, trade policies, regional agreements, multilateral trade negotiations and informal cross-border trade in Africa. He was previously a scientific advisor at CEPII, where he participated in the development of the MIRAGE model of the world economy and the MAcMAP-HS6 database on market access. He has also conducted research on improving trade and trade policy data, the modeling of support for the biofuels industry, the economics of exports restrictions, world agricultural markets, African agricultural trade, multilateral and regional trade agreements, the economics of trade retaliation and the world trading system.



Nuno Limão

Nuno Limão is a professor at the Georgetown University Walsh School of Foreign Service and Economics Department. He holds the Wallenberg Chair in International Business and Finance and is part of the Landegger Program in International Business Diplomacy. Professor Limão joined Georgetown in 2023 from the University of Maryland where he was a Professor in the Economics Department. His primary research and teaching interests include international trade, trade policy, and political economy. He integrates theoretical and empirical approaches to examine a variety of issues, such as how governments choose among redistribution policies, the determinants of trade policy and trade agreements, the interaction between preferential and multilateral trade liberalization, and the effects of trade costs and geographic location. Professor Limão's current research examines how policy uncertainty affects firms and consumers, and how international institutions can manage it. Professor Limão is an Economics graduate from Columbia University (Ph.D.) and the London School of Economics. (B.Sc.). He is a research associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research and the Kiel Institute for the World Economy, as well as an Associate Editor of the *Journal of International Economics*. He has held visiting positions at Yale University, the World Bank Group, the International Monetary Fund, and the United States International Trade Commission.



Anson Soderbery

Anson Soderbery is an Associate Professor of Economics at Purdue University's Daniels School of Business. His work centers on international trade, industrial organization, and applied econometrics, with a focus on how firms behave in global markets and how trade policies shape market outcomes. His research includes empirical and structural analyses of trade elasticities, firm capacity constraints, and the effects of trade policy. He has published studies examining how market structure influences pricing and welfare in international markets and has contributed methodological tools used in measuring trade responses and policy impacts.



Román D. Zárate

Román David Zárate is currently an assistant professor at the UC San Diego School of Global Policy and Strategy. He is an economist whose research sits at the intersection of international trade, urban economics, and development economics, and his work focuses on how different forms of market integration shape aggregate welfare and productivity in developing countries. Before joining UC San Diego, he worked as a research economist in the Development Research Group at the World Bank. He holds a Ph.D. in economics from the University of California, Berkeley.
