Reports

Entrepreneurship and Business

The Entrepreneurship and Business group gave a report on activities related to the programs for 4groups. Gerardo Martinez gave out a handout on the Hispanic Economic Development Corporation (HEDC). A similar program is currently underway in Saint Louis. HEDC created 12 new businesses in Kansas City MO.

Families and Education

The Families and Education committed reported a \$5000 grant to get a program started like JUNTOS. Iowa State and Nebraska have hired a person for Latino engagement. Several publications and grants were submitted. In Iowa, interviews with done with Latino mothers and researchers are expanding the project. Jill, Alejandra and Debra Bolten are working on a grant.

Building Immigrant-Friendly Communities

The Building Immigrant-Friendly Communities wrote several proposals called, Integration of Latinos. Athena spoke about her program – Understanding sense of the Hispanic community in rural Nebraska. Ruben reported that Julia Albarracin finished a new book called "At the Core and in the Margins. Incorporation of immigrations in Illinois." University of Wisconsin Extension has been doing a series of focus groups. It was reported that on August 3rd, PNAE is launching our *Reason for Reform* campaign with a national day of action. Partnership for a New Economy.

Building Diversity-Competent Organizations

The Building Diversity-Competent Organizations committee reported on several project: Latinos farmers project – building Latino farmer competency. Researchers designed their own program based on JUNTOS – Exitos de Educative is the name of the program. This program may be used for other communities. Researchers reported on the results of the survey of extension educators. The report will give a sense of the needs on July 25 at the state wide summit.

Demographics and Change

The Demographics and Change committee reported several activities: (1) Mapping Immigrant Populations workshop, (2) Mosaic Project, (3) Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, and (4) Mapping workshop at Wisconsin. The workshops focused on communities of high need and points of social determination.
