Washington Viewpoint – Looking across the Columbia at the Eagle Creek Fire, story of the fire progression, fire history (1902 Yacolt burn) and fire ecology of Gorge forests

Cascade Locks park area, Historic Cascade Locks, Bridge of the Gods.

Cascade Locks – Lunch at the Bridgeside (location of Incident Command and firefighter accommodations).

At Cascade Locks - Outdoor and Indoor -

Presentation and discussion on: Impacts of Eagle Creek wildfire on Communities, infrastructure, air quality and human health, lives at risk. Suppression costs and suppression related impacts. Fire behavior and Fire suppression story - WUI vs Wildlands.

Discuss renewed partnership efforts to develop strategic landscape-level projects that are more community-centered. Columbia Gorge-Lower Columbia.

Ainsworth State Park, Dodson area - Walking tour. Fire severity, ecology of fire recovery, Burned Area Emergency Response, burn severity maps and statistics. Post-fire restoration needs and goals, infrastructure, trails, roads, recreation sites, forest recovery and restoration plans.
